Registration for UNL Spring Homecoming Events Nears

All alumni and fans invited to participate in dozens of campus activities

The public is encouraged to pre-register for dozens of campus events planned as a part of Husker Spiritfest, the University of Nebraska-Lincoln's annual spring homecoming. A variety of activities, including guided campus tours, lectures, luncheons, the formal dedication of the new Jackie Gaughan Multicultural Center, the Red-White Spring Game and other athletic contests are planned for the four-day celebration, which begins Thursday, April 15, and runs through Sunday, April 18.

The registration deadline for many events is April 5. A registration form and complete schedule of all events is available on the Nebraska Alumni Association's Web site at huskeralum.org/events/alumniweekend. Some of the most popular activities include:

- **Dining Hall Lunch, April 15-16, 11 a.m.-2 p.m.** Lunch at one of University Housing's newly-remodeled, state-of-the-art dining halls. Cost for lunch is \$7.80. Pre-registration is required.
- **Campus Tour, April 15, 2:30 p.m.; April 16, 2:30 p.m. and 4 p.m.** Departs from the Wick Alumni Center, 1520 R Street. Pre-registration is recommended. This event is free.
- **Husker Athletic Tours, April 16, 10:30 and 11:30 a.m.** Includes Tom and Nancy Osborne Complex, Hawks Championship Center & Memorial Stadium. Departs from west stadium lobby
- There is no cost to attend. Tour numbers are limited, so pre-registration is recommended.
- **Sheldon Museum of Art Tour, April 15, 1:30 p.m.; April 16, 1:30 p.m.** No cost to attend. Pre-registration is recommended.
- **Osher Lifelong Learning Institute Presentation: "Research at UNL", April 16, 3-4:30 p.m.** Includes overview of significant research being conducted at Nebraska, from climate change and renewable energy, to childhood literacy and transportation safety. No cost to attend. Pre-registration is required.

In addition to the campus activities, six groups are planning reunions, including the class of 1960, Alumni of Color, Cather Hall/Custer House alumni, Love Memorial Hall alumnae, UNL Libraries former student employees and UNL Campus Recreation Center former employees.
